## HWT... An Overview

Human Welfare trust was started in 2005 in Tamilnadu and was formally registered in 2007 under Trust Act. It started its activities with a health awareness programme, non-



formal education and vocational training center for women. Over the years, we focus has been on the development of poor and marginalized women. The spectrum of activities of HWT include health, livelihoods, sanitation, environment, education and women empowerment and emerging issues those needs to be

attended to.

At present, **HWT** operates in the most marginalized communities in two districts of Chennai, Kancheepuram and working in partnership with people who, because of their caste, religion, culture, gender or economic status, have traditionally been excluded from the social, political, economic and cultural mainstream. Its entire program has been supported by sponsorships and from a network of individual supporters.

HWT covers a population of Kancheepuram and Chennai district .. The target group consists of women, farmers, children and other vulnerable and marginalized sections of the society

- *To carryout AIDS Awareness programme and to obtain grant from Government and other agencies for the above programme.*
- *To run health Centre, Clinics, Hospitals in the Rural areas for the Development of the Rural Population and to conduct Medical Camps of all nature.*
- *To provide rehabilitation services in the time of natural calamities viz. earth quakes, flood, cyclone and Tsunami.*
- *To enable the economic development of the people by imparting vocational and self employment training to them and encourage them to be independent by disbursing loans for self employment schemes.*

## ***Activities in details .....***

### **Training Programme for women**

*HWT has conducted the vocational training such as two wheeler mechanism, computer course and tailoring training, Plumbing, Food processing, Mobile phone repairing and, driving for open school children, each training conducted for a period of one month to three months depends upon the training. Among the 80 students were trained in different batches and timings. 20 students were trained on two wheeler mechanism, 20 students were trained on computer course, 10 students were trained in mobile repairing, 5 students were trained in driving, 5 were trained in plumbing and the remaining 20 students were trained in tailoring course and food processing. The computer course syllabus consisted of the fundamentals of computer, Ms Office (word, excel, power point and concept of internet.*

### **Community Health Camps and Awareness**

*HWT promotes community health initiatives through campaigns on HIV/AIDS awareness, anemia awareness, Cancer Awareness and maternal and child health awareness. We have conduct workshops in schools to educate young boys and girls on proper nutrition, hygiene, health management, and disease prevention. Yoga and naturopathy workshops were conducted for youth and rural women to promote healthy*

*living. Conducted Health camp in the community and did general checkup for the people who have participated in the camp*

*Medicine was given at no cost basis. However, patients were advised to consult doctors, who ever need follow up treatment*

### **Women and child Development Programme**

*The Women members were participated in the awareness campaign, the major topics given through the awareness camps were, Domestic violence's, obtaining the free legal aids, Health related matters, the procedures followed for to get the government schemes, the special features on NREGS scheme, Protecting the environmental degradation, importance of Girl child education, and other related issues pertaining to the villages. We have invited the resource person and she delivered their special notes on the respective scheme. We have also motivate the women on savings through SHGs and educated them on how to avail loan from the bank. The SHG members and youth groups usually attend the meetings and discuss the issues related to HIV/AIDS, trafficking of young girls, unprotected sex etc.*

### **School Sanitation Programme**

*In order to promote importance of health and hygienic among the school children, organized awareness programme on health and hygiene in the schools. We have conducted drawing and easy competition and the best were awarded with prizes to encourage them to follow in their day today life. We have also conducted special sanitation programme for the adult students in the school, in order to educate them on hygienic behavior during their menstruation period.*

### **Tuition Centre**

*HWT has conducted free tuition center for the poor and needy children. We have identified the place in the village and given free education. Free notebooks were given to the poor children to make them to continue their education.*

### **Environment Awareness**

*HWT has been organizing the National Environmental Awareness Campaign (NEAC) with the support of Self Help Groups. This year we conducted the Awareness Campaign to the Farmers, Youth, and School children. The activities of promoting Kitchen Gardening, Making compost from the Waste, tree plantation activities, etc. Nearly 200 Farmers and 500 School Children took participation in the program.*
