HWT... An Overview

Human Welfare trust was started in 2005 in Tamilnadu and was formally registered in 2007 under Trust Act. It started its activities with a health awareness programme, non-formal



education and vocational training center for women. Over the years, we focus has been on the development of poor and marginalized women. The spectrum of activities of HWT include health, livelihoods, sanitation, environment, education and women empowerment and emerging issues those needs to be attended to.

At present, **HWT** operates in the most marginalized communities in two districts of

Chennai, Kancheepuram and working in partnership with people who, because of their caste, religion, culture, gender or economic status, have traditionally been excluded from the social, political, economic and cultural mainstream. Its entire program has been supported by sponsorships and from a network of individual supporters.

HWT covers a population of *Kancheepuram and Chennai district* .. The target group consists of women, farmers, children and other vulnerable and marginalized sections of the society

- To provide rehabilitation services in the time of natural calamities viz. earth quakes, flood, cyclone and Tsunami.
- To enable the economic development of the people by imparting vocational and self employment training to them and encourage them to be independent by disbursing loans for self employment schemes.

Activities in details

Promotion of SHGs among women

HWT were mobilized the rural women to form groups with aims to improving the living condition of the poor by creating sustainable community based institutions. The Self-help groups provide economic benefits to the women by providing income generating activities. SHGs play a crucial role in improving the savings and credit and also in reducing poverty and social inequalities. One of the greatest achievements of the self-help groups is the impact they have had on raising the awareness of local authorities about the needs of people with economic support and the important participatory role people to play in addressing their needs. The next step is to bring all self-help groups together under one umbrella. Capacity building programme was organized to develop knowledge and skills that enable them to become contributors in their families and communities. We motivate the Self-help groups join together to form federations and become self-sufficient. The success of this self-help group has inspired others to form similar groups. We encourage the Groups to discover their ability to understand, plan and implement the activities needed to change their situation and the community.

Awareness programme on COVID 19

HWT has realized that awareness Camps on COVID 19 is much more important among the rural community in order to impart the knowledge on COVID and importance of taking vaccine. We have invited the specialized people to speak about this pandemic situation and vaccine. We conducted the programme by maintaining of social distance and provided mask and sanitizer for all the participants. We have collected the date of vaccination in Public Health Centre and the same was informed to the local community to avail the opportunities

Life skill Education Training:

We have organized Life skills programme for the youth in the community, which was included critical and creative thinking, decision-making, effective communication, as well as skills for developing healthy relationships and a positive self-concepts. We have covered Self-awareness, body language, communication (with peers, with parents), reproductive health, saying "no", how to keep oneself etc. were some of the topics covered during the five-day training. We emphasized that this initiative needs to be

supported and continued so that the number of children attending could be more, and we hope that the children and youth who attended the training would put into practice what they had learned, as well as share their learning with others peers in the community .Due to this Pandemic situation we have organized five virtual Life skill training programme, which was three days programme.

Spoken English course

HWT were organized English spoken class among the youth in the community. We have observed that few youth were studied but feel shy to speak English which will make them to behind in their career. These group of youth were identified and given virtual training on Spoken English, communication and how to attend interview. Youth showed much interest in learning the language. Many volunteers were helped to organize the training programme.

Carrier guidance Programme

We have conducted carrier guidance class for 12th standard children at the beginning of March 2021. An input on what to do after +2, which are the best courses as of now, job opportunities of various courses, scholarship facilities etc. are discussed in the training. Children were enlightened to choose a career which will suit to their bright future. They were also advised to choose a career that matches their interest, skills and values, significantly increases the chances for success and personal happiness.

Free aid to the poor and needy people

We have distributed the food items to the need and jobless people in the community. Some people were got the medical assistance from us. We have formed the youth groups to identify the need of the local community and selected the deprived people and helped them. Many donors and help minded people were help us to help them.

Observation of national & International Important days

HWT celebrated and observed the national and international important days in order to create awareness on the important days. We conduct different cultural programme like quiz, drawing competition by virtually and given prizes for the children. Though it was a

pandemic period, it's our regular celebration and have conducted both personally and virtually to observe these days. , The following important days were observed by HWT
